Photoshop at its core is designed for creating composite images: Removing backgrounds, creating layers with different adjustments, manipulating perspectives and aligning everything into a coherent scene - that is what Photoshop is all about! However, compositing is incredibly nuanced and difficult to get right... until now.

Besides all the editing techniques, the PiXimperfect Compositing plugin includes looks, seamless texture patterns and effect overlays to refine the final output. "When it came to looks, it was important to not just deliver lookup tables. Users want full control to modify the looks and we agree", says Unmesh. "That's the reason we work with Photoshop, isn't it?".

To deliver on this objective, Picture Instruments used their expertise to develop a randomizing function that allows the user to call up an infinite number of similar looks. By manipulating color, saturation, tint and contrast, the plugin provides limitless inspiration. "Though the inspiration function is 'random', all looks appear harmonious and balanced. There is a lot of color theory and time baked into this sophisticated system." Explains Robin. "But watch out," Unmesh interjects with a twinkle in his eye, "the buttons for randomizing the looks automatically can be very addictive."
